Community Notice

The Non-Member Residence Code was implemented on May 18th, 2015. The implementation phase and transition phase of the code have been completed. Amendments were made in 2019. The non-member residency clerk, Mr. Louis Naranjo is taking applications for new individuals, expired sponsorship, and those re-applying. You will need to apply for permitted residence before you establish residence on Santa Clara Lands.

- Any Non-Member Residents currently residing on Santa Clara Lands who have turned 18 years old will have 90 days from the date of their 18th birthday to apply for residency.
- Those who have voluntarily relinquished their Membership from Santa Clara Pueblo through Council action do not qualify for Non-Member Permitted Residence.
- If you require a new, replacement, or renew your ID, please contact the OVSE office at (505) 692-6325 to make an appointment.

Come by the Vital Statistics / Enrollment Office, to pick up an application for Permitted Residency and/or to update your NMR ID card. Thank you for your attention and cooperation.

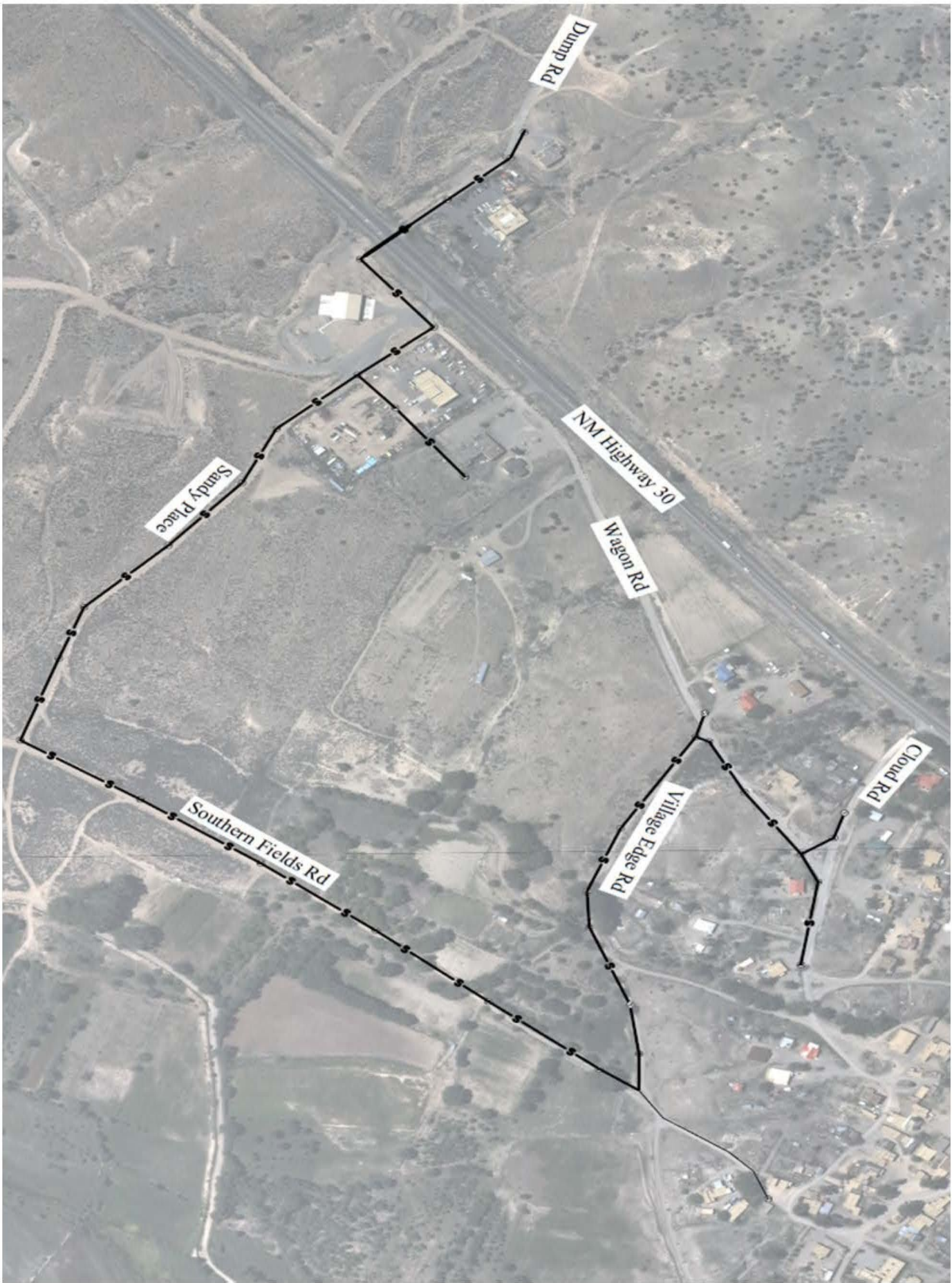

This notice is to inform you of an upcoming construction project that will focus on installing the sewer mains and a lift station in the Village area. See attached map. The objective is to install new sewer mains and a lift station to remove homes from septic tank systems. This project is a benefit to the Pueblo as it will replace failing infrastructure, improve operations and maintenance.

CF Padilla, LLC from Isleta Pueblo is the Contractor who will be working on the project along with Souder Miller and Associates. Traffic may be diverted to different locations during this time, please be mindful of construction workers and maintain your speed.

This work is expected to be completed in July 2024. The Santa Clara Tribal Administration appreciates your patience during the construction phase. Accounting/Procurement Department

Happy New Year from the Accounting/Procurement Staff!

The Accounting/Procurement Department continues to provide accounting/procurement services to all Santa Clara Pueblo departments who receive Federal and State, local, funding as well as the Pueblo's General Fund.

The department is responsible for the financial management in accurately identifying revenue received from these entities and accurately identifying costs incurred by these Federal and State funded programs. The Pueblo is a Self-Governance tribe and all programs are administered and accounted for at the Tribal level.

The department is audited annually on all federal and state funds received. The Tribal Council requires an annual audit of the general fund as well. All audits are performed by an independent CPA firm and the Pueblo's financial statements are prepared by the Department with the assistance of financial consultants. As of today, we are in compliant with updated audits completed to December 31, 2022.

We have successfully implemented an electronic timecard system (iSolved) for all employee to enter hours worked vs paper timesheets; and working very well. We are currently working on an electronic purchasing software (Microix) which will allow program departments to submit purchase request electronically. Our goal is to become "paperless" but continue to be accountable and transparent in all our transactions.

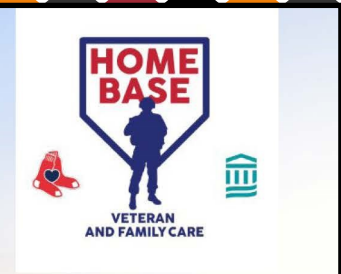

Home Base Native Intensive Clinical Program

Lifesaving care for Native American Veterans, Service Members and their Families – all at no out-of-pocket cost.

Native Americans serve in the United States Armed Forces at higher rates than any other ethnic group. Yet, the unique needs of Native American Veterans, Service Members and their Families facing challenges with geography, infrastructure and access to specialty care make it exponentially more difficult for those impacted by the invisible wounds of war.

Our innovative **Native Intensive Clinical Program (ICP)** was built upon our flagship ICP through consultation with Native American Veterans, tribal leaders and healthcare administrators. The Native ICP provides long sought after healing and lifesaving care to Native American Veterans, Service Members and their Families at no out-of-pocket cost to them.

Our next cohort will be held from June 16-28, 2024, at our National Center of Excellence in Charlestown, MA. Additional offerings are currently in development. Please contact us for more details.

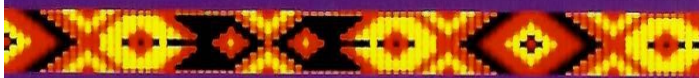

Fentanyl Awareness Youth Challenge



SAMHSA is seeking the best ideas from U.S. youth, aged 14-18, on a community strategy to educate their peers about fentanyl and fake pills — and prevent drug overdose deaths.

SAMHSA wants youth to pitch ideas that educate peers and their communities (among their friends, at school, or within an organization to which they belong) about fentanyl and fake pills with the goal of preventing overdose. Ideas could include innovative ways to reach youth on this topic, such as social media posts, vlogs, podcasts, video journals, etc. Youth can participate individually, or as part of a team.

Who May Apply- Any Pueblo or community youth ages **14-25 years old.**

Duties: All youth workers will learn historic masonry and plastering techniques, wildlife inventory and maintenance of ancestral trails.

Working environments: which include inclement weather such as heat and rain, windy dusty conditions and will often involve the company of rodents, reptiles, and biting /stinging insects.

All crew members will work 8 to 10 hour days and may include the following tasks:

- Lifting of objects up to 50lbs. Involve frequent bending, kneeling, and hiking of steep slopes and pre-historic trails.
- Mixing sand and dirt to create proper texture for mortar and using wheel barrels and buckets to transport to work station/ work site.
- Use of hand tools such as; shovels, hoes, Pruners, Rakes, Etc.
- Crew bosses will conduct daily briefings to crew members on work site awareness, safety precautions, hazards, and proper use of equipment.
- Perform other Tribal Historic Preservation Office (THPO) related tasks as advised from supervisor or Rights Protection staff.

Applications can be picked up from the Santa Clara Pueblo Office of Rights Protection/THPO, Monday through Friday 8:00am to 4:30pm, or from the Santa Clara Pueblo Human Resources Office. **All applicants must also submit Driver's Licenses/Identification Card and Social Security card with his/her application, also all applicants over 18 years of age must be willing to submit to a background check and random drug testing. Any youth ages 14-16 must obtain a workers permit from New Mexico Department of Workplace Solutions.**

Closing date April 12, 2024 by 4:30 pm or until all positions are filled.
