A Free Medical Screening Program for Former Department of Energy Employees, Contractors, Sub-contractors and Supplemental Labor



As a Los Alamos or Sandia National Laboratory worker, you may have been exposed to radiation and other hazards, such as asbestos, beryllium, lead, loud noise, silica and solvents. Even if you did not handle toxic substances directly, you may be at an elevated risk for occupational illness.

Doctors trained in occupational medicine test for work-related illnesses that other physicians may overlook.

The goal of the free medical screening is to identify health conditions early, **when medical treatment is more likely to be effective.** The screening may identify a new health condition, confirm an existing one, or help address concerns about previous exposures. Also, the screening includes tests you are unlikely to receive through your primary care physicians, such as testing for:

- Asbestosis
- Hearing loss
- Beryllium sensitization
- Some cancers

Exams are available at a location near you and our occupational medicine physicians will review your results and provide a detailed written letter with findings and recommendations. If work-related illness is suspected, the letter providing your examination results may help support a Department of Labor **Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program (EEOICP)** or state workers' compensation claim. The doctors in our program are not employed by the DOE. Your information will be kept **confidential**.

Even if you feel healthy, you should participate in the WHPP medical screening program.

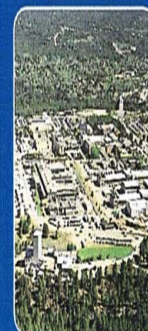
You may not have noticeable symptoms if an illness is in an early stage. Even if you are not feeling sick, the WHPP screening may identify work-related health problems, for which early medical intervention can make a difference. There is also a general wellness component of the exam to test for non-occupational conditions such as elevated cholesterol and high blood pressure. While important for your overall health, these conditions are *not* compensable.

Physicians at Johns Hopkins University are now collaborating with the Worker Health Protection Program (WHPP) to screen even more workers moving forward, building upon each program's 25 years of experience serving former DOE workers.

Early detection of lung cancer with low-dose CT scans

Participants may also be eligible for lung cancer screening with low-dose CT scans. The goal of the CT scan is to detect lung cancer in an early stage, when treatment is more likely to be effective. Eligibility for the low-dose CT scan is based on age, occupational exposure and smoking history. As of March 2024, over 14,000 WHPP participants have received low-dose CT scans for early lung cancer detection. WHPP has detected 224 lung cancers, with the majority (72%) found in early stages. While smoking causes most lung cancers, many workers are at an increased risk due to exposures to known lung cancer causing agents, such as asbestos, silica dust, beryllium, diesel exhaust and radiation.

"The WHPP Early Lung Cancer Detection Program has literally saved my husband's life. Had you folks not alerted us about this program, he would never have checked for lung cancer until it was too late. Thanks to the program, his lung cancer was caught at a very early stage and was treatable."

To date, over 16,000 former DOE workers at high risk of lung cancer at selected sites throughout the country have participated in low-dose CT scanning through the FWP. The primary goal of lung cancer screening is to detect cancers in an early stage before symptoms occur and when cure is likely.

At present, only 2% of people eligible for lung cancer screening in New Mexico are currently screened. The expansion of lung cancer screening to former DOE workers in New Mexico will benefit program participants and will raise awareness of this life-saving screening to others at-risk of lung cancer throughout the state.

Occupational health experts at the City University of New York and the Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health independently administer this program to provide objective medical evaluations, with funds provided by the DOE through a cooperative agreement (Award Number DE-FC01-06EH06008). To date, this program has served over 40,000 former DOE workers for over 25 years.

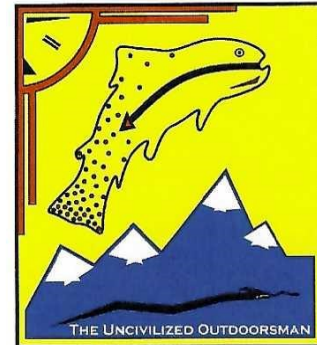

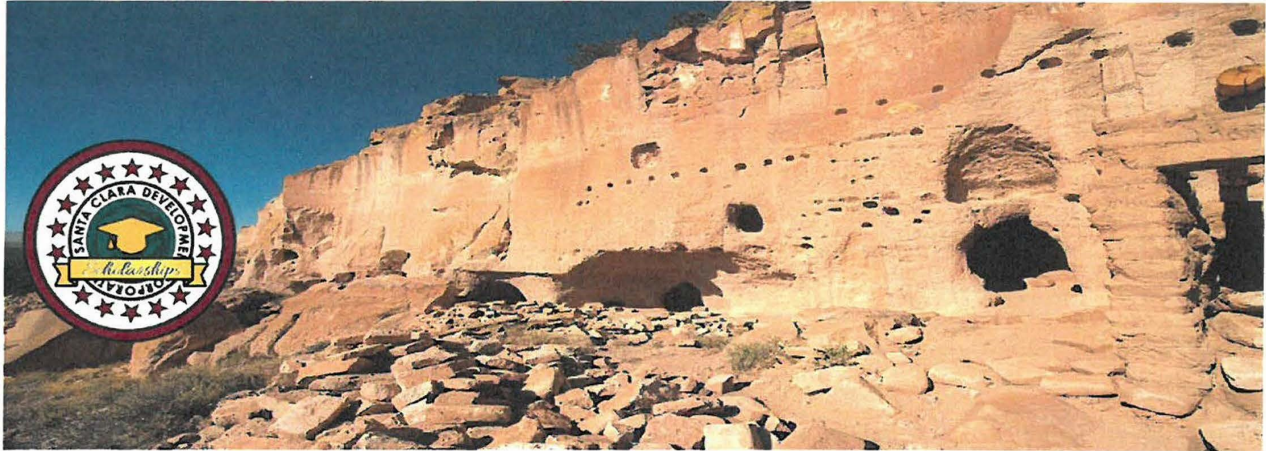
