RE: Flow of traffic in Village area for Feast Day

This letter is to inform the Community of changes in the flow of traffic on August 12, 2025 Feast Day.


On this day the flow of traffic will turn into a one-way street on (1) Back Wall Road Head South to Cloud Road (2) Hillside Road will head Southeast to Back Wall then South on Cloud Road (3) Drum Road will head South onto Cloud Road then South exiting at State Road 30. Wild Rose Road will be closed for the day on August 12th 2025 at the entrance/exit off State Road 30 and at KEE Street. This will take effect at midnight on August 11th, 2025.

Please be mindful of all signs and personnel that are posted in areas. Also, as a reminder the speed limit in the Village Area is 10 miles per hour (MPH) or otherwise posted.

Vending will only be allowed in designated vending area next to the Church. If others are set up they will be asked to move or be asked to be taken down.

Please remind family members, visitors and guests that there will be no cell phones allowed in Main Village, no picture taking or recording of any kind. All rules will be posted in different locations.

The Santa Clara Pueblo Tribal Administration Human Resources (HR) Department's role is to identify and respond to employment needs for the community that are in line with the Tribe's mission statement. The Human Resources Department provides services in recruiting, employee development, employee relations, benefits, classification and compensation, and operations that provide a positive and diverse work environment applicable to tribal, federal and state laws. The Human Resources Team is a dedicated group that provides quality customer service with integrity, respect and confidentiality to all community members and staff.

The HR Department has been fortunate to have Mr. Charles "Matt" Sisneros join our HR Team in March. Charles Matthew Sisneros is a Tribal Member from Santa Clara Pueblo and the Human Resources Generalist. Matt currently serves on the Santa Clara Pueblo Tribal Council and was an elected Official. Matt is a graduate from the Santa Fe Indian School and attended college at Northern New Mexico Community College and Northern Arizona University. Matt has worked for the Santa Clara Pueblo Tribal Administration for approximately 10 years and worked with the Vital Statistics Department, Law Enforcement Department, and now with the Human Resources Department. As the HR Generalist, Matt's duties include filing, interviewing, attending job fairs for recruitment, purchasing and assisting with new employee on-boarding.

In July Ms. Phillips worked with the summer students with the Dept. of Youth & Learning (DYL) and their students to provide Healthy Snack Presentations. Fall Nutrition Classes will begin Sept. 11, 2025, at 10am in the CHR Conference Room.

I transport clients to appointments and do home visits, order medications, pick up & delivery of medications daily. At events, I provide an information booth for the Child Find at Kha'Po Community School and for the Summer Kick Off at the gym. I am always talking to people at these events.

Blood Pressure checks are being provided twice a month at the Senior Center from 10:30 AM to 12 PM. So, stop by our table if you see us!


Jonathon Tafoya, Community Health Planner B.S. Social Psychology


