Originally called Decoration Day, it was formalized by a "Memorial Day Order" issued by Grand Army of the Republic Commander-in-Chief John A. Logan in 1868.

The modern proclamation calls on Americans "to observe Memorial Day by praying, according to their individual religious faith, for permanent peace."

Santa Clara Pueblo hosted several important meetings today, May 19, 2026. The FEMA Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) project with Tetra Tech involves exploring Resilient Community Building Codes.

The code standards will be developed to reduce vulnerability to hazards, improve energy efficiency and establish the foundation for safer, more sustainable development. To be more effective, the Building Code standards will be tailored to reflect sovereignty, cultural values and community priorities.



The other portion of the meeting was presented by Pioneer Tech Services/GEI on Scoping Canyon Flood Mitigation and roadway design. The Team is reviewing the previous efforts at preventing road impacts from flooding. The goal of this project is to propose the best way to reestablish access and roads construction in Santa Clara Canyon that will not be prone to washouts. The two Santa Clara Tribal programs overseeing these projects are Emergency Management and Tribal Forestry.

SAFETY BRIEF

Spring & Summer Safety Brief

As many people perform weed and yard maintenance this time of year, we wanted to help raise awareness to promote safety for you, family, friends, and neighbors

Myrtle Spurge (Euphorbia myrsinites)

What is it: A low growing perennial that has succulent tail-like stems of blue-green leaves with yellow-green flowers. A drought tolerant plant native to Eurasia, introduced to North America as an ornamental plant. This plant is a noxious weed and proliferates easily. Myrtle Spurge is a "List A" noxious weed in Colorado, Oregon, and parts of Utah and must be eradicated on all property. This plant is non-native to New Mexico and very invasive. The plant is strongly allelopathic, aggressive, and will prevent other plants from growing nearby.

Beware! All parts of this plant are considered poisonous.

Toxicity: The plant will exude toxic, milky latex sap which can cause severe skin irritation including blistering. If sap comes in contact with eye it can cause severe irritation, pain, and in some cases blindness. Children are more susceptible than adults. Pets can have similar reactions.



Safe Removal

On your property, Myrtle Spurge is easily removed by hand. **CAUTION!** Wear gloves, long pants, and a long-sleeved shirt when pulling. Recommended eye protection or safety goggles.

- Don't let children play with the plant! Wash skin and clothes after contact
- Pull before it produces seed, which is viable for eight years
- The weed has a tap root. Remove at least 4 inches of the root when pulling Myrtle Spurge
- Bag the spurge and tie or fasten bag closed
- Do NOT compost as this can spread the weed to other locations. Do not burn or incinerate! Bag and place in trash for pickup
- Tell your neighbors and friends to purge the spurge

Health Risk

The milky sap is toxic and will severely irritate skin and eyes and is toxic if ingested.

- Exposure to the skin can cause blistering and severe skin irritation
- Ingestion can cause nausea, vomiting and diarrhea
- Eye contact can cause severe eye pain, possible blindness, and require copious irrigation and medical treatment for 8 to 12 hours

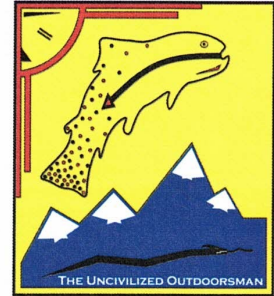
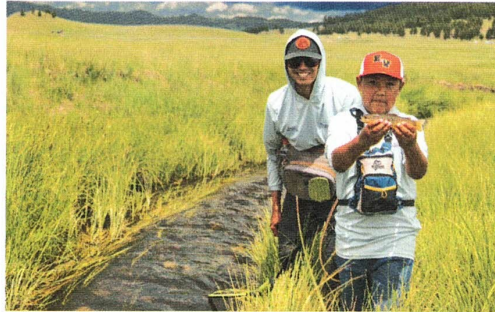

Valles Caldera National Preserve 2026 Indigenous and Hispanic Youth Fly Fishing Experiences are free and all-inclusive fly fishing camps for youth between the ages of 7 - 18 years of age and who identify as Indigenous or Hispanic. These camps will take place on July 25th, July 26th, August 8th, and August 15th, 2026. Applicants will only be able to participate one day, so choose the date that works best for you. These outings are single day camps that start around 8:30 am and end around 4:00 pm. No knowledge of fly-fishing is needed. The camp will provide all gear for the participants free of charge and all entry fees will be covered. This is an all-inclusive camp that will educate the children about their culture, history, and language through the skill of fly fishing, while being guided by Indigenous and Hispanic mentors. All events will take place at Valles Caldera National Preserve in northern New Mexico. Participants will need a valid NM Fishing License if 12 years of age or older. 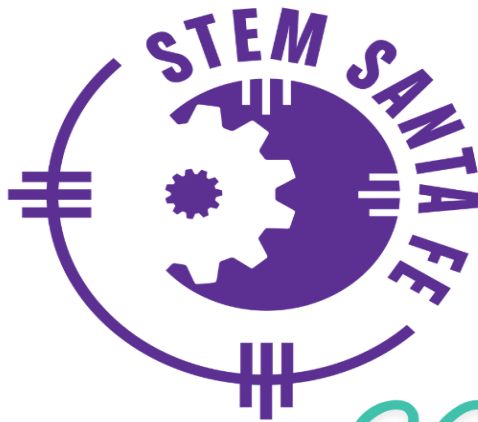

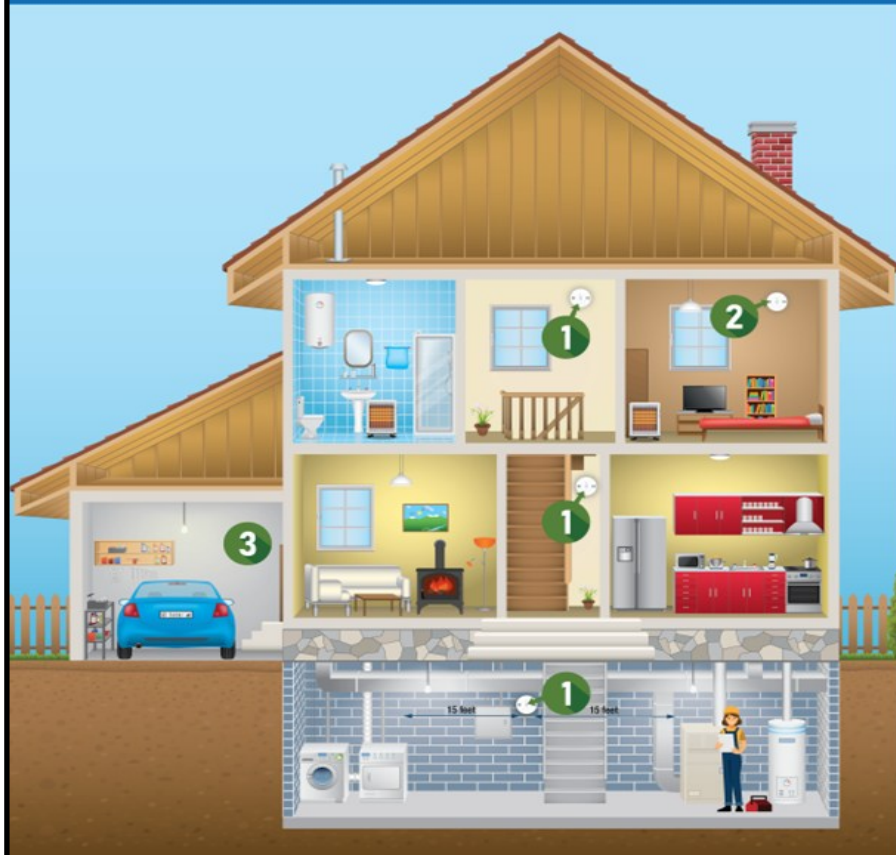

Carbon Monoxide Alarms

Protect Your Family and Yourself



Place CO alarms:

- In a central location on every level of the home's livable space (including the basement) and at least 15 feet away from any fuel-burning appliance.
- Near or inside each sleeping area in the home.
- Inside the home near the door leading to the attached garage and in rooms over the garage.

REMINDERS

- Test CO alarms monthly.
- If possible, interconnect your CO alarms — when one sounds, they all sound.
- Follow manufacturer instructions and all applicable laws and building codes for CO alarm placement and replacement frequency/schedule.

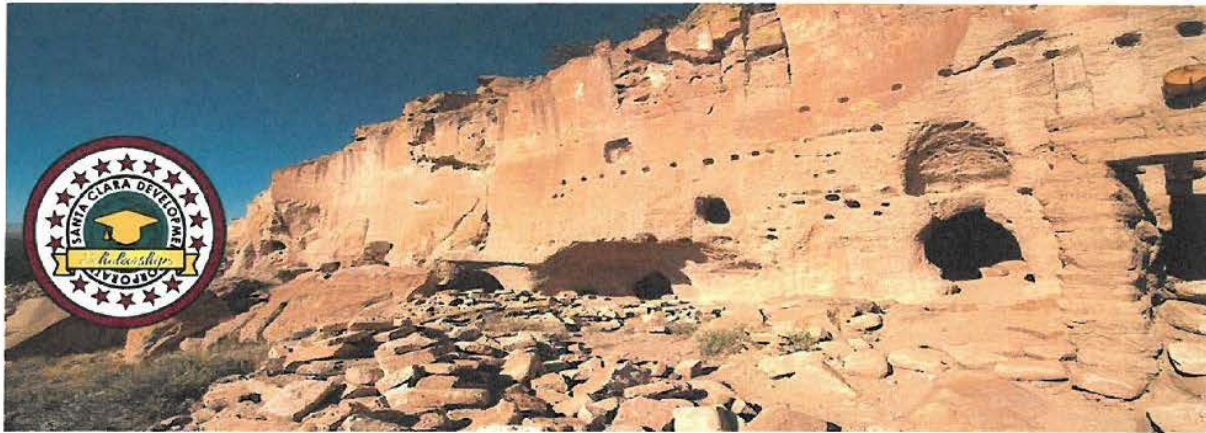
