RE: Reminder **No Fireworks**

Reminder -Fireworks of all types are prohibited by Council resolution. (Resolution 2000-20 - Prohibiting Fireworks on Santa Clara Land) There are penalties for those who do not adhere to this law. The fine is \$300 igniting and/or having fireworks in your possession.

Santa Clara Tribal Law Enforcement, Conservation Officers and the Fire Department will be enforcing these restrictions, and it is important that we all work together on this issue to avoid further damage to our natural resources and personal property. We are hopeful that these conditions will improve.

Thank you for your cooperation and please report any illegal burning immediately to our dispatch or 9-1-1. A state-wide burn band is in effect.

Animal Control Officer Matthew McKale and Espanola Humane Society “Pet Amigos”. The partnership will be providing free rabies vaccination services on July 18, 2026, from 10 am-2 pm

We anticipate administering approximately 75 vaccinations. To maintain a smooth, calm environment, we kindly ask that you keep your pets in your vehicle until you are called up for service. This approach helps us manage the flow and keep stress levels low for your pets. This is a wonderful opportunity to ensure your pets are protected against rabies, a vital step for their health and the health of our community. This effort is an attempt to ensure all pet owners are abiding by the Santa Clara Pueblo Animal Control Ordinance Section 89.10 “Rabies Vaccination. The Animal Control Ordinance penalty if a pet is not vaccinated for rabies is (\$10.00) plus the cost of the vaccination.

Greetings Community Members:

The Pueblo's Transportation Program continues to move forward with important transportation upgrades aimed at improving safety, accessibility, and comfort for bus riders throughout the community. Recently, the "Blue Bus" shelters located adjacent the Tribal Administration Building on Kee Street and adjacent the Pueblo's Housing Authority on Roadrunner Road were upgraded to replace the concrete platforms, replace the shelter structure to add solar lighting and to ensure ADA accessibility. The Pueblo utilized the awarded FY 2022 Federal Transit Administration discretionary grant funds in the amount of \$140,000.00 for the planning/design, and construction of these bus shelters. With an agreement with the North Central Regional Transit District (NCRTD), Wilson & Company Engineering Firm completed the plans and design; and GM Emulsion LLC completed the construction of the bus shelter transit projects.

For the Kee Street bus shelter, a windscreen has been ordered to be retrofitted to the back of the shelter to provide protection from the elements for riders waiting on the bus. The production timeline for the windscreen is about 3 months. We encourage you to ride the "Blue Bus" Santa Clara Route #160 that provides fare-free service between the Pueblo and Espanola and Santa Fe, Monday through Friday (see details at ncrtd.org/all-routes/160-santa-clara). NCRTD also provides MyBlue on-demand rideshare service for \$1 each way that allows residents in our area within a 15-mile radius of the Espanola Transit Center to access convenient curb-to-curb transportation (see details at ncrtd.org/demand-service).

CALL FOR ARTWORK

Visual artists in all mediums and styles (weavers, sand painters, silversmiths, beaders, potters, painters, basket makers, photographers, etc.) are encouraged to bring their artwork to the Art in Public Places Open Call to be reviewed by the Santa Clara Pueblo Artwork Selection Committee for possible purchase and permanent installation.

LOCATION & TIME

Artists must bring their completed artworks in person on **Monday, July 20th at 11 AM** to the Pueblo of Santa Clara Gym at 578 Kee Street, Espanola, NM 87532. Please be prepared to stay for up to 2 hours and to fill out a W9 tax form.

BUDGET

The State of New Mexico has \$101,000 to spend to acquire artwork for permanent installation in buildings throughout Santa Clara Pueblo including the Governor's Office, Headstart, Community Health, Adult Day Care Center, Senior Center and Fire Station.

PROCESS

The Santa Clara Pueblo Artwork Selection Committee will review artwork in person and make selections to be purchased by the State. New Mexico Arts will issue payment to the artist/s selected upon receipt of signed contracts and completed installation at the Santa Clara building. This opportunity is part of the Art in Public Places Program.

Fixing household leaks right away saves up to 20 gallons a day

Washing only full loads of dishes and laundry saves up to 50 gallons per week

Spending only 5 minutes in the shower saves up to 8 gallons each time

Turning off water while brushing your teeth saves up to 2.5 gallons a minute

Buying water-saving devices like high-efficiency washing machines or toilets saves many gallons a day

Using a broom instead of a hose to clean your driveway saves up to 150 gallons each time

Cutting down on watering your lawn to 1-2 days a week saves up to 840 gallons

Watering your plants in the early morning or evening to reduce evaporation saves up to 25 gallons each time

Checking your sprinklers for leaks and repairing quickly saves up to 500 gallons a month

Installing a smart sprinkler controller that adjusts watering based on weather saves up to 40 gallons a day

Check Your Utility Bill

A place to start is to examine your utility bill for January or February. It's likely that a family of four has a serious leak problem if its winter water use exceeds 12,000 gallons (or 16CCF) per month. You can also look for spikes - is your water use a lot higher this month than it was last month? Learn more about your water bill: <http://1.usa.gov/1Qw3Eg9>.

Read Your Water Meter

Find your water meter, which is usually near the curb in front of your home but can be inside your home (e.g., in the basement) in cold climates. Use a screwdriver to remove the lid on your meter, which is heavy and usually marked "water."

Now that you've found the meter, take a reading during a period when no water is being used. If the meter does not read exactly the same after two hours, you probably have a leak. Here's a tip on how to read a water meter: <http://bit.ly/1TeYnMu>.

Take a Toilet Test

Put a few drops of food coloring into the tank at the back of your toilet and let it sit for 10 minutes. If color shows up in the bowl, you have a leak. Make sure to flush afterward to avoid staining, and consider replacing your old toilet flapper if it is torn or worn.

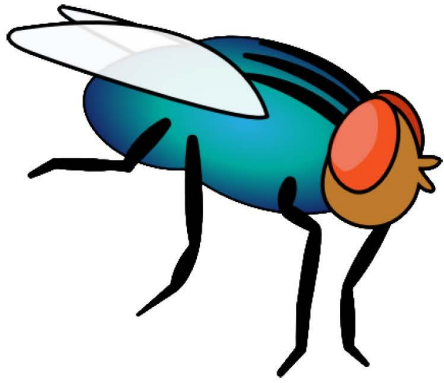

NEW WORLD SCREWORM (NWS)

What Tribal Communities Need to Know



- The New World Screwworm is a **fly that lays eggs in wounds and body openings of living warm-blooded animals**, including livestock (cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs), pets, wildlife, and humans.
- The New World Screwworm **larvae (maggots) dig into flesh and feed on living tissue**, which causes severe harm, intense pain, and often death if left untreated.
- New World Screwworm has been spreading across Central America and **has now reached the U.S.**

How Does New World Screwworm Spread and Cause Harm?



1. The New World Screwworm fly lays eggs on the edges of wounds or body openings such as the nose, mouth, eyes, ears
2. The eggs hatch into larvae, commonly called maggots, within 12-24 hours
3. The larvae/maggots dig into wounds, feeding like a screw into wood
4. The larvae/maggots feed on living flesh for 3-7 days, causing extensive damage

Other New World Screwworm (NWS) Facts

- Wounds as small as a bug bite may attract a NWS fly to lay eggs.
- After feeding for 7 days, larvae/maggots drop to the ground, burrow into the soil, and emerge as adult screwworm flies.
- Treating NWS should involve a veterinarian or doctor and includes physical removal of larvae/maggots, intensive wound care, and antiparasitic medications.

IMPORTANT!

Only flies can spread NWS.

It cannot spread from animal to animal or person to person.

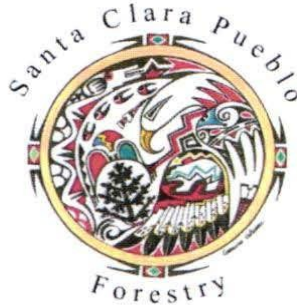
