Due to the cancelation on July 18th, we have rescheduled a day for vaccination on august 22, from 10am -2pm.

We anticipate administering approximately 75 vaccinations shots. In order for us to maintain a smooth and calm environment: we kindly ask that you keep your pets in your vehicle until you are called up for service. This approach helps us manage the flow and keep stress levels low for your pets. This is a wonderful opportunity to ensure your pets are protected against rabies, a vital step for their health and the health of our community this effort is an attempt to ensure all pet owners are abiding by the Santa Clara Pueblo Animal Control Ordinance Section 89.10 "Rabies Vaccination. The Animal Control Ordinance penalty if a pet is not vaccinated for rabies is (\$10.00) plus cost of the vaccination.

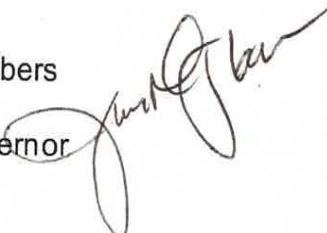

General Business - Two (2) Board members shall work, have worked or have obtained a degree in the business area and have general knowledge of business operations and management, organizational planning, capital planning, local labor markets and financial planning.

Pueblo of Santa Clara Residents,

Continued construction on the Fiber-to-the-Homes project is ongoing. This project will bring reliable high-speed internet directly to your home. The Contractor for the project is **Kha'P'o Construction**. This project includes digging, trenching and areal connections to your home. This fiber line is being installed at no cost to you. Work will include utility locating, surveying and staking, trenching and excavation, fiber optic cable installation, backfilling and compaction and surface restoration. Trenches may be approximately 12 inches (1 foot) wide x 12 inches deep. Landscaping, vegetation, gravel, decorative rock, irrigation systems, and other surface improvements may be temporarily disturbed during construction. Reasonable efforts will be made to restore disturbed areas to substantially the same condition that existed prior to construction. Construction activities are anticipated to occur between **7:00 AM and 6:00 PM, Monday through Friday**, although schedules may vary due to weather, site conditions, or project requirements.

Service- Initial service will be provided by the Pueblo to ensure connectivity and test speeds and operations. Once the system is in full operation you can maintain connectivity by signing up to a monthly service. Pricing has not been determined at this time. It will vary depending on speed and operation fees which will be determined at a later time.

Consent forms are required even if you deny service.

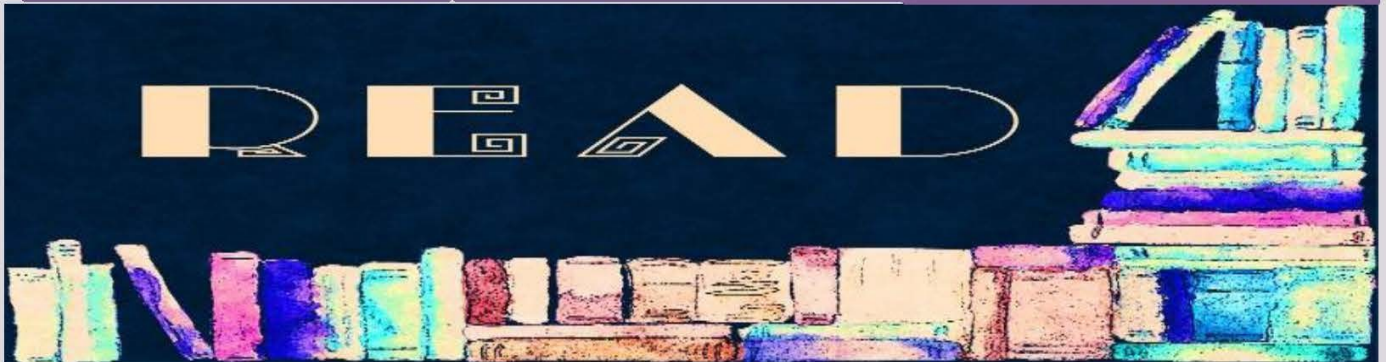
Resources:

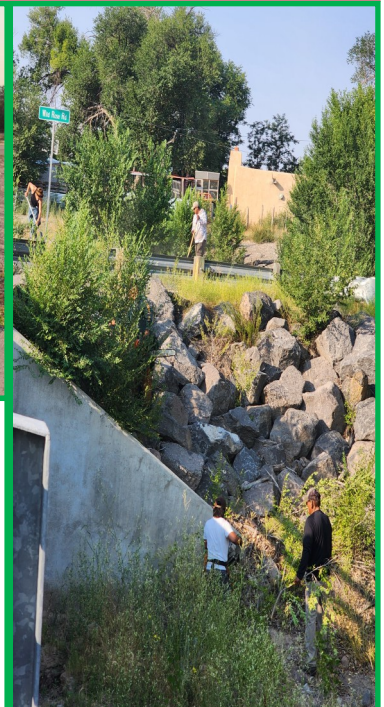

On July 29th , Global Santa Fe, brought a delegation of officials from the Parliament of the Solomon Islands to Santa Clara Pueblo. The delegation is visiting the US to learn about the various forms of government; the federal and the state of New Mexico and the government of the Pueblo.

The Solomon Islands are an independent, sovereign nation located in the Pacific Ocean north-east of Australia. They country gained their independence from Great Britian in 1978. Currently, their government operates as a constitutional monarchy with a parliamentary democracy; retaining the British monarch as head of state represented locally. The Solomon Islands are famous for the intense World War II history, specifically the Battle of Guadalcanal fought for 6 months in 1942-1943, which halted Japanese expansion toward Australia.

Our guests were welcomed by Lt. Governor Jesse Gutierrez and representatives from various departments that mirrored the Solomon Islands representative's program areas. Former Governor J. Michael Chavarria, speaking as the Director of Rights Protection, presented a briefing of the various laws and policies that affected the sovereign standing of tribal nations through history. The Solomon Island representatives stated that they were especially impressed to hear about the values placed on heritage connections, traditional language importance and the continued teaching to the youth of values that have sustained the Pueblo since the beginning of time.

After the presentations, the Solomon Island representatives were taken to Puye where they were provided a brief history of Puye and the connections to our ancestral home.



The Youth Conservation Crew leaders informed our guests about the work they have been doing at Puye, from the materials they use to the challenges they face being on top of a mesa. The group visited the room block currently having mud plaster applied both to the interior and the exterior walls. Our guest went into the roofed structure to feel the coolness provided by the use of surrounding natural materials in it's construction and now, in preservation.



The representatives were impressed by the importance and connection to our history and the significance of homes built by our ancestors. One member stated, after this visit, he is now very interested to visit more museums in his country and to learn more about the objects from his own heritage.

Even though our guests live at sea level, 4 of the 6 representatives walked down from the top of Puye. They all were impressed by their visit.



The Office of Vital Statistics and Enrollment is pleased to announce a tribal enrollment opportunity for all interested individuals seeking enrollment with the Pueblo of Santa Clara.

The Office of Vital Statistics & Enrollment (OVSE) is currently accepting and distributing completed Tribal Enrollment applications. This service is available from **8:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday, with a designated lunch break from 12:00 PM to 12:45 PM, during which the offices will be closed.** Each application will be accompanied by a checklist outlining the required documentation and a background check form. This form allows submission of the applicant's information to the Maximum Reports Background Company, a resource our office has used for many years.



What happens when you submit your completed application?

Upon submitting your application, all required documentation must be provided to our office, along with the \$100.00 application processing fee (**non-refundable**). Please note that we only accept money orders for this fee. All necessary documents must be signed, notarized, and finalized when submitted at the time of entry. If your application is inadequate, it will be returned to you until all documentation is properly completed.

Minors under 18 will be included in their parents' application, provided the necessary documentation is submitted to the OVSE. Everyone who is 18 years of age or older must personally sign for and collect their application packet; family members may sign out a packet on another individual's behalf.

What happens when I submit my application?

We will schedule a meeting with the Tribal Council to review the submissions. You will receive notification of your application status by postal mail.

If you have been selected to proceed with the enrollment process, you may be granted



status as a conditional member for a duration of two years. Please be advised that during this period, you will not possess the rights to vote, acquire land, or apply for educational scholarships and Indian Health Service (IHS) benefits, among other privileges.

Upon the completion of the two-year conditional membership period, you will be subject to an in-person reinterview conducted by the Tribal Council to assess your enrollment membership

status.

Office of Vital Statistics & Enrollment

The Santa Clara Pueblo Office of Vital Statistics & Enrollment would like to both inform and remind Enrolled Members and Non-Member Residents of the Non-Member Residency Code.

Individuals aged 18 or older who are either residing in or seeking to reside within the boundaries of Santa Clara Pueblo are required to apply for residency. According to the Non-Member Residency Code, non-members may remain in the area for up to 5 days per month without applying for residency. Should the individual exceed this timeframe while visiting, it is imperative to initiate the application process, or further infringements may apply. For further clarity and to prevent any potential miscommunication, it is advisable to contact the NMR Clerk in the Office of Vital Statistics so that the NMR Committee can be properly informed.

Attention all approved non-members: Please be informed that if you are not married to or adopted by an enrolled member and have not resided here for more than ten years, you will be required to renew both your Non-Member Status and ID Card every five years from the date of your initial approval. Non-members who do meet these criteria will only be required to renew their Non-Member IDs every five years; these expiration dates are indicated on their NMR ID cards.

All approved male non-members between the ages of 18 and 65 are mandated to participate in any cleanups sanctioned by the Tribal Council. Should any individual be unable to attend, it is advisable to contact the Office or the Tribal Sheriff to arrange make-up work to avoid incurring fines. Doctor's notes and other forms of excuse documentation may be submitted to the Sheriff for approval, either in person or via email.

- Social Security Card
- CIB (If enrolled elsewhere)

- For renewal applications, residents may inquire about their status by telephone. Alternatively, the Committee will send a letter notifying residents of their renewal status and/or the associated deadline.

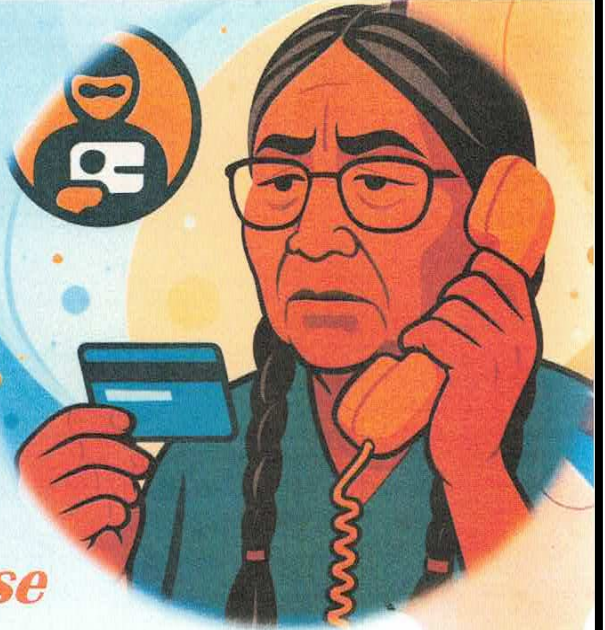
