Re: Food Waste in Residential Dumpsters

There is a noticeable increase in bear activity in the residential areas. The animals are being attracted to residential dumpsters and food waste.

For your safety we ask that you take all food waste directly to the transfer station until the danger is reduced. The Transfer Station is open Wednesday through Sunday 8-5.

Also, we are looking into opening the Transfer Station on Monday and Tuesday as well once an additional Caretaker can be hired.

Do not leave pet food outside. This also attracts bears, small animals and rodents.

Reminder do not approach any bears. Report any sightings to dispatch or directly to the Sheriff.

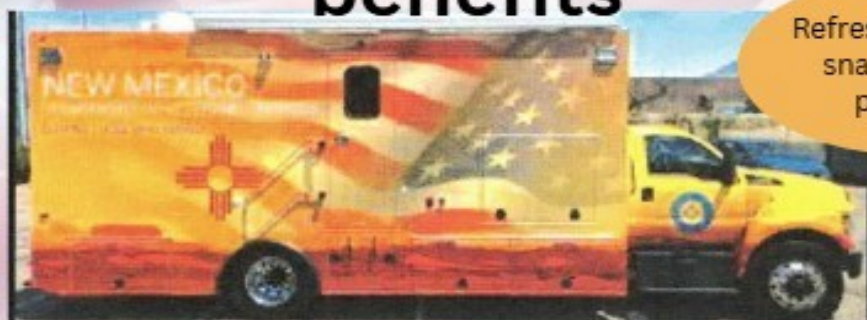

2026 Youth Conservation Corps Report



The Santa Clara Pueblo Rights Protection office is pleased to report on another successful season collaborating with the New Mexico Youth Conservation Corps. Santa Clara Pueblo and the YCC program have been in collaboration since 2007 and have since employed tribal youth aging from 14 to 25 years of age to perform ancestral masonry and restoration techniques within the historic Puye district. This summer consisted of a full 21-member team, including (3) crew bosses and (18) crew members each performing a multitude of tasks including the upkeep of the main plaza, restoring ancestral trails, mud mixing, and plastering of the room block walls. YCC crew members also assisted various tribal departments with daily work duties, learning a wide-array of skill sets and experience.

Tribal youth on this cultural endeavor began each day at 7am, and were briefed by Rights Protection staff on the importance of teamwork, leadership, and respect when working at our ancestral homelands. YCC crew members endured 10-hour shifts working in summerlike conditions at Puye. Crew members were also offered a variety of trainings and presentations given by several tribal departments. The Forestry Department educated youth on BK radio systems, the importance of situational awareness and how to identify hazards when working within the canyon and along the mesa top. A certified CPR training was presented to the youth, allowing youth to attain certificates from EMT instructors upon completion. Alex Suazo, Espanola Fire first responder, presented on incident response, and how to detect early stages of heat stress and dehydration. Behavioral Health provided anti-bullying and mental health seminars which taught the youth teamwork, engaging all crew members with respect, and showcasing the many resources the department has to offer.

The Rights Protection Office- devoted to cultural, historic, and archaeological preservation recognize the importance and impact of introducing youth to their ancestral origins. The centerpiece of this project was to inspire, motivate, and spark interest in our tribal youth to implement resiliency and establish support for protecting ancestral sites that are essential for Santa Clara Pueblo's future survival. Tribal youth on this cultural endeavor gained extensive knowledge on their ancestor's way of life, and learned of the hardships and adversity they overcame to survive. It also inspired youth to engage more in their traditional practices, and to understand the connection to our future survival as Santa Clara Pueblo people. The Rights Protection office would like to thank everyone involved in this year's YCC program. Kunda Wo'ha.

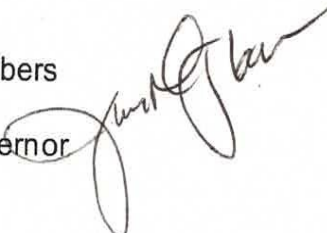

The Commission shall be composed of five voting members and one non-voting member. The non-voting member will be a current member of the Tribal Council during their term as a Commission Member.

To the extent practicable the voting-member Commissioners shall be composed of individuals who possess skills and knowledge in the following areas:

General Business - Two (2) Board members shall work, have worked or have obtained a degree in the business area and have general knowledge of business operations and management, organizational planning, capital planning, local labor markets and financial planning.

General Business - One (1) Commission member shall work, or have worked in the public utility industry or have obtained a degree in the utility area or related field, and have general knowledge of regulatory interfacing, local labor markets strategic planning issues for utilities, and utility industry regulatory agencies.

Continued construction on the Fiber-to-the- Homes project is ongoing. This project will bring reliable high-speed internet directly to your home. The Contractor for the project is **Kha’P’o Construction**. This project includes digging, trenching and areal connections to your home. This fiber line is being installed at no cost to you. Work will include utility locating, surveying and staking, trenching and excavation, fiber optic cable installation, backfilling and compaction and surface restoration. Trenches may be approximately 12 inches (1 foot) wide x 12 inches deep. Landscaping, vegetation, gravel, decorative rock, irrigation systems, and other surface improvements may be temporarily disturbed during construction. Reasonable efforts will be made to restore disturbed areas to substantially the same condition that existed prior to construction. Construction activities are anticipated to occur between **7:00 AM and 6:00 PM, Monday through Friday**, although schedules may vary due to weather, site conditions, or project requirements.

Service- Initial service will be provided by the Pueblo to ensure connectivity and test speeds and operations. Once the system is in full operation you can maintain connectivity by signing up to a monthly service. Pricing has not been determined at this time. It will vary depending on speed and operation fees which will be determined at a later time.

Consent forms are required even if you deny service.

2026 General Election

If you or anyone you know is interested in becoming a poll worker in the County of Rio Arriba, we encourage all private citizens to vote and become involved in the election process. One of the most rewarding ways to do this is to become an election official. Citizen involvement is essential to conduct open, accurate, and fair elections in the State of New Mexico. We hope that you will consider participating in one of these positions. Rio Arriba County Clerk's Election Workers Applications can be found online or at the County Clerk's Office. These paid Election Worker positions are compensated based on hours worked.

Requirements: The person must reside in Rio Arriba County. 16- and 17-year-olds are eligible to work as election officials. Must be able to read, write and have excellent communication skills. Must execute the precinct board's member's oath of office. Must maintain and respect the confidentiality and integrity of the election. Must remain impartial at the election poles and during the election process. Cannot be employed by law enforcement.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities: Maintain election equipment security throughout the election process. Knowledge of general election procedures. Knowledge of basic computer and office skills. Ability to comprehend, learn and follow New Mexico election laws and instructions given by the County Clerk, Bureau of Elections Chief or, designee. Ability to carry out the precinct board's members functions with acceptable skills and dispatch. Ability to recognize election issues and promptly report any issues to the Presiding Judge or County Clerk as necessary. Ability to work well with others and participate fully in a team-oriented environment. Must always remain professional.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities: Attends official election training. Determines voter eligibility through residential verification and poll list. Issues ballots to eligible voters. Response to voter's questions regarding voter's procedures. Adheres to election laws, policies, rules, and regulations. Performs other duties as required.

Physical Demands: While performing the duties, the employee must sit for long periods, speak, listen, type on a computer, or write in a roster. The employee may occasionally be required to stoop, kneel, crouch, or lift and carry items weighing up to 20 lbs.

Work Environment: Work is performed in an indoor setting with a moderate noise level. Long hours, evenings, holidays, and weekend work may be required with advance notice.

Training and Compensation: Election officials are required to attend mandatory training before the election the 28 or 29 of September 2026 a total of 4 hours. Training helps to ensure a thorough understanding of the election process, the importance of maintaining the integrity of the election, and their role on Election Day. Election officials receive payment for their service and mileage to and from the election training. Individuals interested in serving as Election Board Members or being placed on the standby list are encouraged to complete an Interested Election Worker form or for more information, please contact Rio Arriba County Clerk Sarah Archuleta at her office, phone number 505-753-1780 or by email, SArchuleta@rio-arriba.org

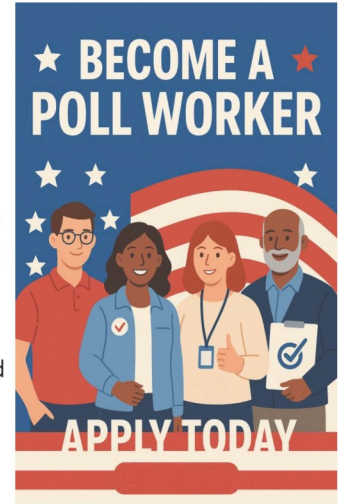

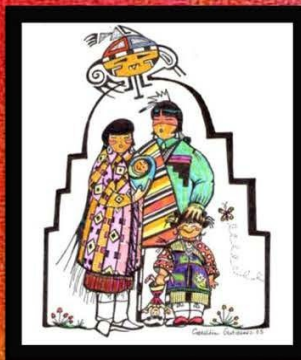

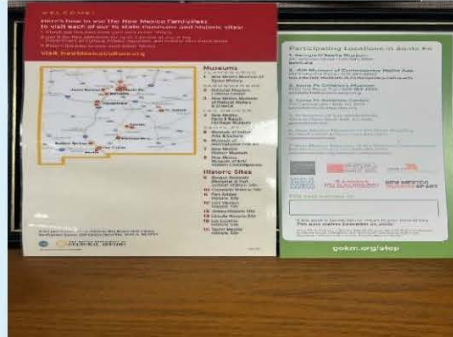

Six At-Home BearWise Basics



Never Feed or Approach Bears

Intentionally feeding bears or allowing them to find anything that smells or tastes like food teaches bears to approach homes and people looking for more. Bears will defend themselves if a person gets too close, so don't risk your safety and theirs!



Secure Food, Garbage and Recycling

Food and food odors attract bears, so don't reward them with easily available food, liquids or garbage.



Remove Bird Feeders When Bears Are Active

Birdseed and grains have lots of calories, so they're very attractive to bears. Removing feeders is the best way to avoid creating conflicts with bears.



Never Leave Pet Food Outdoors

Feed pets indoors when possible. If you must feed pets outside, feed in single portions and remove food and bowls after feeding. Store pet food where bears can't see or smell it.



Clean & Store Grills

Clean grills after each use and make sure that all grease, fat and food particles are removed. Store clean grills and smokers in a secure area that keeps bears out.



Alert Neighbors to Bear Activity

See bears in the area or evidence of bear activity? Tell your neighbors and share information on how to prevent conflicts with bears. Bears have adapted to living near people; now it's up to us to adapt to living near bears.

Black bear is a species; common colors include black, brown and cinnamon.
